### WHY DID YOU DO AN APPRENTICESHIP?

In 2017, I joined East Cambs District Council as an administration assistant for both planning and building control. My main duties were to achieve historical files and assist with administrative tasks. I was based in the Building Control office and was influenced by being part of the Building Control office environment for 2 years. In that time, I was involved in interesting conversations with colleagues talking about fascinating topics. It immediately made me interested in the technical side of the job and I wanted to learn more. I was always asking questions about what they were talking about because I was genuinely engrossed by the conversations taking place. My manager approached me to see if I wanted to pursue a career in surveying which led to me being offered a place on Wolverhampton University's first Building Control Apprenticeship Degree.

### HOW HAS STUDYING AN APPRENTICESHIP PREPARED YOU FOR THE WORLD OF WORK?

Taking part in my apprenticeship taught me valuable life skills along with on the job skills. My course taught me how to work towards deadlines with assignments, whilst the work experience side of the apprenticeship taught me lots of valuable skills such as professionalism, people skills and communication skills. Balancing study life and work life taught me how to manage my time, which I believe is a crucial skill to learn for both working life and everyday life.

### WHAT LEVEL APPRENTICESHIP ARE YOU STUDYING?

I studied for my apprenticeship whilst gaining the practical work experience with East Cambs District Council.
